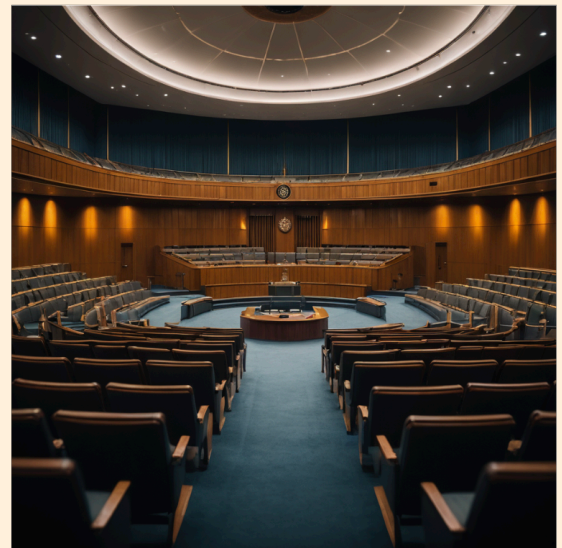

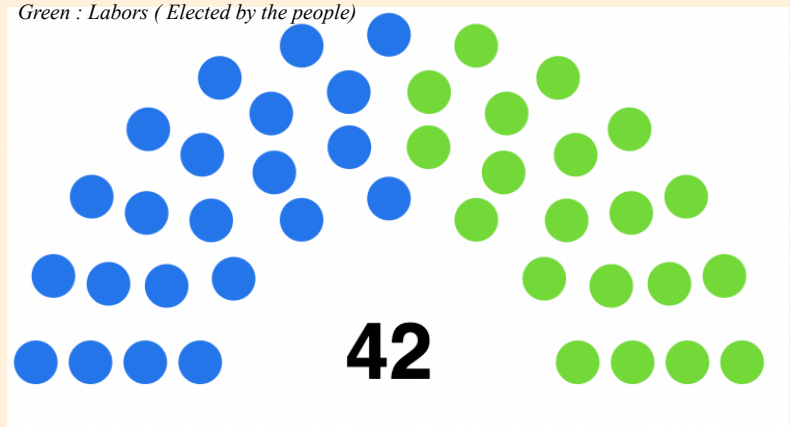

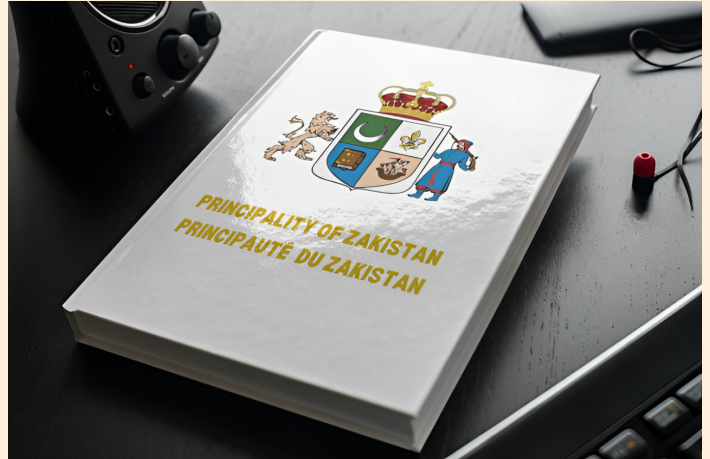


*Chart 1 Zakistan National Council Blue : Royal Party (Appointed by Prince)

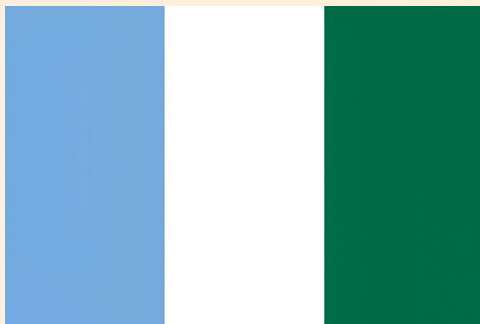

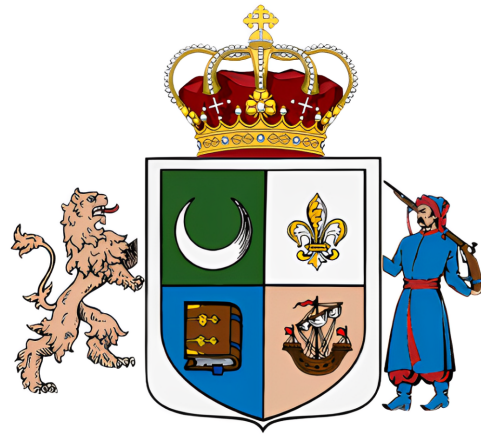
